WHO DO I ASK?

Administrator: Barb Griffin – Office hours for the Resort Village are the first Friday of every month from noon to 6:00 PM. The Village Council meeting begins at 6:30PM. Barb will help you with general enquiries, taxes, or a lost boat launch key. Barb is our web-master and administers the information being entered on the website to provide you with information about upcoming events, minutes of past meetings, current by-laws, and information regarding permits that are required by the village eg: building, development, trailer, quads etc.

Mayor : Tim Selinger – Tim will be able to answer questions or concerns regarding the boat launch and pier, the garbage and recycling schedule and rules, and our position regarding the landfill/lagoon . mayorglenharbour@sasktel.net

Councilor and Deputy Mayor: Deb Kachluba – If you are planning on building, renovating or developing your property Deb knows the process and the by-laws that you must adhere to for your permits. The village hires a Bylaw Enforcement Officer. Deb is the council member that is in contact with that person if you have a question or concern.

Councilor: Ken Loszchuk – Ken is the man to see regarding roads/road maintenance, including snow removal. Dust control will take place in May. The Village uses a product that contains calcium chloride in small amounts and stays bound to the soil on the road. Any effect on vehicles is unlikely to occur. The product has been in use since the 1920's and is still used by the Provincial Government. If a street sign is down or a street light is burned out report it to Ken. If you have a concern regarding grounds maintenance Ken will investigate. He is in charge of updating the community sign so the village has up-to-date information on events.

Lorne will look after your concerns regarding the cleaning & maintenance of the Center. Councilor: Judi Kehler – The village is a member the Parkland Regional library which is located in Strasbourg. Judi is our representative on the Library Board. The village also maintains an active website which is regularly updated to provide you with information about upcoming

events; twice a year a Newsletter is produced providing further information. Judi monitors the website on a regular basis and writes the Newsletter. HIGHWAY UPGRADE

YAHOO!! Surfacing on Highway 322 from 4.83 km northwest of Silton to .30 km north of the Glen Harbour access road, a total distance of 10.82 km scheduled to start May 15th but due to favorable weather conditions the resurfacing is starting ahead of schedule to be completed by July 15th (weather permitting).

PUBLIC AREAS

PUBLIC BEACH

Please remember that the public beach is available for the enjoyment of all. **Open fires and open liquor are not allowed at any time in this area.** Please help to keep this area clean and safe for everyone.

BOAT LAUNCH AND DOCK

Trucks and boat trailers must be parked in the designated area at the boat launch site. This area is for day parking only. Please remember to shut the gate **AFTER** you launch your watercraft and after you have brought your watercraft off the water.

A NEW floating dock has been purchased and will be installed for the 2018 watercraft season. It was partially funded through a Government Grant.

Stop the spread of invasive Mussels such as zebra and quagga mussels that pose a serious threat to lakes in western Canada. They are almost impossible to get rid of once they are established. Zebra and quagga mussels are easily spread by recreational boats, and there are a few important things that boaters can do to help prevent the spread of invasive mussels.

- Be sure to thoroughly inspect your boat and trailer. Remove any aquatic weeds and scrape off and throw away any suspected mussels.
- Drain all water from your boat and equipment before leaving the lake or pond.
- Do not reuse any live bait that has contacted infested water.
- Thoroughly rinse and dry boats, motors and trailers when you get home.

NEW!! BOOK SWAP LOCATED IN THE GAZEBO

You will notice an addition to the Gazebo installed for the purpose of a **BOOK SWAP**. You may take any book(s) free of charge, in exchange for leaving a book(s) for someone else to find and read.
