Please also note that all ratepayers are welcome to attend any of the regularly scheduled Council meetings in an observation capacity only.

Your council utilizes the billboard at the entrance to the village, in an effort to keep all residents informed of current events, news, announcements, and meetings.

Welcome to Lorne Maxwell who joins us after being the successful candidate in the bi-election held on Sat. Sept 2, 2017 completing a three year term vacated by Jason Reichert. Lorne brings his knowledge of Glen Harbour and Council from his term as Mayor from 2009 to 2012.

Road Maintenance: Two main arteries were graded. Roads are in excellent condition due to this year's dry summer season. No additional gravel was required. Dust control measures lasted through the season, also due to minimal rainfall. The excavation and re-instatement of one abandoned catch basin is scheduled for this fall. All culvert inlet and outlet openings that require excavation to provide proper drainage have been identified.

Enforcement Officer: The Commissionaires provided a Bylaw Enforcement Officer for the summer months. The Officer patrols the village once a week, providing Council with a report. Starting in 2018, Council will be taking a more active role in enforcement of the bylaws.

Professional Building Inspections, Inc. (PBI) is the company currently providing the village with residential National Building Code of Canada inspections and enforcement services.

SPORTS AND RECREATION

End of another season so thank you to Trevor Sebastian for his annual installation and removal of the buoys in the swimming area.

Presently the Village does not have a Sports and Recreation Committee, however many volunteers stepped forward to initiate the following events:

A new horseshoe pit area will be created during the 2018 season. It will be located north of the Community Center, closer to the washrooms and gazebo. Fencing with a gate will be installed, providing access to the new horseshoe area and additional security for the community center. A gate and shorter fence will be installed on the east side of community centre. This will provide easier access for unloading firewood and access to picnic tables, as required. Sod, pits, backstops and score boards are scheduled to be completed next spring.

Ken & Leona Loszchuk hosted a Rider Game night on July 08, 2017 at the community centre. Thank-you to the 60 plus Rider fans that participated in the event. After selling the leftover items, approximately \$500.00 was made for the Sports & Rec account.

On Saturday, Aug 19th, a committee of volunteers, chaired by councilor Deb Kachluba, prepared the Glen Harbour Community Roast Beef Dinner Fundraiser. \$8,484.00 in net profit was raised for future Sports and Recreation activities. This profit includes proceeds from the 171 dinner tickets that were sold; the cash bar sales, the raffle ticket sales and silent auction of donated items from both personal and business donations, as well as 50/50 ticket sales. **THANK-YOU TO EVERYONE WHO DONATED PRIZES, FOOD ITEMS AND TIME TO MAKE THIS EVENT A GREAT SUCCESS, AND TO OUR RESIDENTS FOR ATTENDING AND SUPPORTING COMMUNITY FUNCTIONS.**
