As the end of another year approaches, the Council of the Resort Village of Glen Harbour wishes you warm holiday greetings and a very safe and happy season!

2013 has been a very busy year for Council and much progress on updating the policies and operations of the Resort Village has been made.

Some of the many projects that Council has completed include:

- ❖ Drafting and adoption of a new bylaw relating to the operation of golf carts within the Resort Village of Glen Harbour. This bylaw has been sent to the provincial government for approval and will be posted on the Resort Village's website as soon as that approval is received.
- ❖ Drafting and adoption of a new traffic bylaw for the Resort Village. This bylaw relates to speed limits, speed bump locations, operation of ATVs and parking. This bylaw has been sent to the provincial Ministry of Highways for approval and will be posted on the Resort Village's website as soon as approval is received.
- ❖ Drafting and adoption of a new building bylaw. This building bylaw has been approved by the provincial Ministry of Government Relations and is available for your review on the Resort Village's website under the Zoning and Building bylaws category.
- ❖ Completion of the draft of the Resort Village's new Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw. These bylaws are in the final stages of processing at the Resort Village level and will be forwarded on to the provincial Ministry of Government Relations near the end of January, 2014. It is anticipated that these new bylaws will be effective in early-May, 2014.
- ❖ All of the necessary ground work for the new community multi-purpose building is complete. Power service has been trenched in and the water well is drilled. Many of the building supplies have been obtained or sourced.

As we look forward to 2014, plans are already being put together for Glen Harbour:

- Construction work on the multi-purpose building will begin as soon as the weather allows in spring. It is anticipated that this building will be ready for use at some point during the summer months.
- Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) has confirmed that a physical inspection of all properties at the Resort Village of Glen Harbour will be completed in 2014. This means that we will be welcoming a team of assessors from SAMA to the Resort Village to inspect the physical attributes of each building and structure located within the boundaries of the Resort Village. More information regarding this process will be made available in the spring of 2014.
- Introduction of a new format for the Resort Village of Glen Harbour website aimed at making the information on this site easier to navigate and locate.
- The possibility of garbage collection changes is being discussed. Some options include the introduction of recycling facilities and the introduction of curb-side garbage collection. Stationery garbage bins would also remain in place for garbage disposal. If you have any thoughts on these options, please contact Councillor Deb Kachluba and let her know your opinion or concerns.

Be reminded that all property taxes are due and payable December 31, 2013. Please ensure that your tax payments are in the possession of the Resort Village administrator no later than the end of the business day on December 31, 2013. Any amounts that remain outstanding on January 1, 2014, are eligible to have a 12% late payment penalty applied.

If you have any ideas or suggestions about services or improvements that you would like to see put in place at the Resort Village of Glen Harbour, please contact any member of Council with your ideas over the winter. All input and ideas are greatly appreciated and welcomed by Council.
