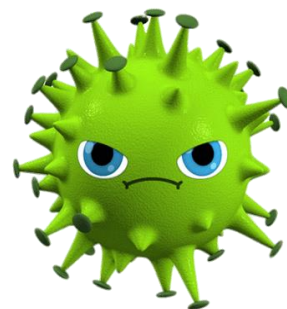

Council meeting dates will be posted on the Resort Village's website and on the bulletin board as you enter the Village. Meetings may be conducted on-line through ZOOM. If you wish to attend a meeting to bring a matter to Council's attention, please contact the Administrator at least 10 days prior to a scheduled meeting in order to arrange a time for you to address Council. Please also note that all ratepayers are welcome to attend any of the regularly scheduled Council meetings in an observation capacity only. Anyone attending these meetings is required to sit quietly and observe the deliberations of Council or if on ZOOM to be present visually but without audio.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

#### COVID-19

During this epidemic the Washrooms, Playground, Gazebo and Book Swap will be closed.



Distancing will be required on the beach and the Boat Launch. Signs will be posted reminding residents to keep the two meter distance and to use precautionary measures such as masks, hand wipes and sanitizers.

All events will be discontinued until further notice, including Horseshoes, and rental of the Community Center.

Until further notice the size of public and private gatherings will remain at a maximum of 10 people.

## **New By-laws and Policies:**

**Bylaw No. 57/2019** an agreement with The Town of Strasbourg respecting fire suppression and rescue services signed Dec 21, 2019.

**Notice:** Beginning April 1, 2020 the volunteer Fire Call-out rate for the Strasbourg & District Fire & Rescue is being increased to \$5,000.00 for the first three hours of attendance, plus \$1,500.00 for every additional hour of attendance. Please check with your insurance provider that you are carrying enough of a fire call-out limit. Your municipal property taxes do not cover the call-out costs and you will be responsible. Notice from the Town of Strasbourg is posted on the bulletin board beside the boat launch gates.

**Resort Village of Glen Harbour** Bonfires and Open Air Fire Policy 2019. The Policy is posted on the bulletin board beside the boat launch gates.

**Zoning Bylaw 22/2013** updates to certain sections of the Bylaw regarding the use of trailers/recreational vehicles as dwellings are being drafted and will be provided upon completion.

## **Harbour updates:**

Two new benches have been purchased to be installed on the beach. A swimming raft has also been purchased. Both items will be installed when it is deemed safe to do so after the COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted. The swimming area will be moved west on the beach to accommodate the new swimming raft and provide a safer place for children to access the playground.

You may have noticed some new trees surrounding the Harvey McEwan Park – thanks go to Stan Dahl and Randy Kachluba for making our village a more beautiful place.

The Resort Village of Glen Harbour was incorporated from a Hamlet effective July 1, 1986. Nominations for Mayor and two Councilors took place in May, 1986 with Douglas Hunter, resident of Strasbourg as returning officer. The first meeting of council was held on Monday, July 7, 1986 at 7:30 in the public meeting room of the Main Public Library, Regina, SK. The first mayor was Mac Smith.
