VILLAGE INFORMATION

Public Washrooms: Hours for the public washrooms for the summer are 9:00 am to 9:00 pm.

Discharge of sewage: We would like to remind residents that all liquid wastewater that is not storm water or clear water waste must go into your septic holding tank. Residents suspected of diverting wastewater will receive a letter from the Village requesting compliance. Non-compliance will be reported to Environmental Public Health Department for investigation. All sewage including kitchen, lavatory (toilet, bath and shower) and laundry is considered liquid wastewater. Residents that are aware of illegal discharge is encouraged to report non-compliance. *(Submitted by Mayor Debbie Kachluba)*

Bylaw Enforcement: We are changing our reporting process for bylaw enforcement. This year, a complaint form will be available online which can be completed and submitted directly to the Bylaw Enforcement Officer. Garbage : The summer forecast is for another hot summer and I'm sure everyone will recall how bad the garbage can smell after sitting in the hot sun for a week. In order to keep the smell to a minimum it's every resident's responsibility to follow a few basic practices. We haven't decided where the bins will be this summer but it's likely they'll be somewhere down by the community center. We got a lot of complaints last year about the smell so please do your part to keep this problem to a minimum. Areas of concern from last year are... Dead fish washing into shore. If this happens again this year DO NOT throw them in the garbage. I know options are limited (burying was recommended) but if you must put it in the garbage, then please put dead fish in a sealed plastic bag to keep the smell down. Being in a bag will also ensure the rotting fish goes out with the next garbage pickup rather than rotting in the bottom of the bin. Please use this principal for all items going in the garbage Especially items like dead fish, loose grass, dog poop. Anything that will rot and stick to the bins if not bagged. *(Submitted by Councillor Elise Sinclair)*
